25 CALL TAKER: Hello?

C. BEALS: (inaudible). Hello.

CALL TAKER: Hi, what is the address?

30 C. BEALS: Yes, I need the police down at my house right now.

CALL TAKER: What is the address?

C. BEALS: Well I'm at High Park.

CALL TAKER: High Park?

5 C. BEALS: Yes.

CALL TAKER: Where are you in High Park?

C. BEALS: I'm at 100 High Park, twentyfour sixteen.

10 CALL TAKER: Twenty-four **[17:14:00]** sixteen?

C. BEALS: Yes. And I need the police and I need them now.

CALL TAKER: Okay. And what is going on?

15 C. BEALS: My son and daughter are fighting. My son and daughter. Don't, (inaudible) the police are on the phone. She's throwing bottles right now. My daughter's throwing bottles right now.

20 C. BEALS: Yeah.

R. KORCHINSKI: I told you (inaudible). Mom, I told you (inaudible) .

CALL TAKER: Okay.

C. BEALS: Reece...
CALL TAKER: ... name?
30 C. BEALS: ... and Regis.

CALL TAKER: Ray and Rachel?

C. BEALS: Reece and Regis.

CALL TAKER: Okay. You need to tell me their full names. So, what's Rachel's

C. BEALS: Regis -- Regis, uh, uh, uh, Paquet, and Reece Korchinski.

CALL TAKER: Can you spell the last name for me?

C. BEALS: I don't know if I need a ambulance, because I left my house. I can't stand in there. I'm ■-years-old, I ---

5 CALL TAKER: Okay. Where are you now?

C. BEALS: I'm out in the hallway.

CALL TAKER: What's your name?

10 C. BEALS: Out in the hallway.

CALL TAKER: What's your name?

C. BEALS: My name -- my name is Claudette Beals.

CALL TAKER: Can you spell that for me?

15 C. BEALS: It's B-E-A-L-S.

CALL TAKER: What's your first name?

C. BEALS: My name is Claudette.

20 CALL TAKER: Claudette?

C. BEALS: Yeah.

CALL TAKER: Okay, **[17:21:00]** Claudette. And what's your last name?

25 C. BEALS: My last name is Beals, B-E-A-L-S.

CALL TAKER: Do you know what they were fighting over?

C. BEALS: Yeah. No, I don't know. Uh, uh, my daughter had a seizure this morning and so this is how, basically, it all started. And he knows just to leave her alone.

C. BEALS: But now she's calling me all kinds of names, [17:22:00] calling me a bitch and everything else, right?

CALL TAKER: Hm-hm.

C. BEALS: So, I don't want her -- I want the police to take -- literally, take her out of my house.

C. BEALS: I don't want her here. I don't want no kids living in my house...

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CALL TAKER: Okay.

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C. BEALS: ... and not this stuff.

C. BEALS: Okay. She's got to go tonight.

C. BEALS: I -- I told you my daughter's name is Regis. Go back.

CALL TAKER: Oh, Regis. Okay.

15 C. BEALS: Did she put you out? Did Doreen put you out? Why would you leave?
(inaudible) go back in, you've got kids. You better go down by the
elevator. [17:23:00] Like, you -- you -- take the steps and go
downstairs or something. Just go. You ain't getting back in my house,
you know this. I'll get your stuff...

20 CALL TAKER: Okay. Claudette.

C. BEALS: After police come.

CALL TAKER: Claudette?

25 C. BEALS: Yes.

CALL TAKER: Just walk away from her right now until police arrive, okay?

C. BEALS: Okay. Just go (inaudible) with the kids...

30 CALL TAKER: Just so you don't worked up.

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C. BEALS: ... (inaudible) with the kids.

CALL TAKER: And do you have any flulike symptoms?

C. BEALS: No.

CALL TAKER: Okay.

C. BEALS: Are they almost here?

CALL TAKER: They're on their way, okay.

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CALL TAKER: Emergency, do you need police, fire or ambulance?

R. KORCHINKSKI: Police, police.

CALL TAKER: Okay. Where do you need the police?

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R. KORCHINKSKI: One hundred High Park Avenue. [17:18:00]

CALL TAKER: One hundred High Park?

R. KORCHINKSKI: Yes.

CALL TAKER: Okay. Is that a house or an apartment?

R. KORCHINKSKI: It's an apartment.

CALL TAKER: What's the apartment number?

R. KORCHINKSKI: Twenty-four sixteen.

CALL TAKER: Okay. Did you call earlier?

R. KORCHINKSKI: If it wasn't me, which it wasn't, it either was my mom or my sister that did.

CALL TAKER: Okay. What's going on there?

R. KORCHINKSKI: It's a physical altercation between me and my sister. My name is Reece Korchinski.

CALL TAKER: Okay.

R. KORCHINKSKI: Yes.

CALL TAKER: **[17:18:30]** Did she assault you or did you assault her?

R. KORCHINKSKI: She initiated the assault with two knives, right. But I also did protect myself, right. So. But I'm not going anywhere, I'm going to stay right here.

CALL TAKER: Okay. What's your...

R. KORCHINKSKI: Right.

CALL TAKER: ... name?

R. KORCHINKSKI: Reece Korchinski.

CALL TAKER: How do you spell your last name?

R. KORCHINKSKI: K-O-R-...

CALL TAKER: Yeah.

R. KORCHINKSKI: ... C-H-I-N-...

CALL TAKER: Yeah.

R. KORCHINKSKI: ... S-K-I.

CALL TAKER: Okay. And what's your date of birth? **[17:19:00]**

R. KORCHINKSKI: [REDACTED].

CALL TAKER: [REDACTED]? Okay. So, your sister, she's -- you said she has two knives?

R. KORCHINKSKI: And she's actually -- she actually came out to continue the problem. You can actually hear her.

CALL TAKER: Okay. So, she ---

R. KORCHINKSKI: I'm just in the staircase.

CALL TAKER: You said she had two knives?

R. KORCHINKSKI: So -- so if you listen closely. Listen.

CALL TAKER: Okay. Is that her yelling in the background?

R. KORCHINKSKI: You hear? It's -- it's -- it's not stopping, right.

CALL TAKER: Okay. Is that her yelling...

R. KORCHINKSKI: She doesn't even...

CALL TAKER: ... in the background?

R. KORCHINKSKI: ... know I'm in the staircase, right? So.

CALL TAKER: Okay. So, let's back up here for a second. **[17:19:30]** You said she had two knives?

R. KORCHINKSKI: Two knives, yes.

CALL TAKER: Okay. Does she have them on her now?

5 R. KORCHINKSKI: Yeah, she still does. She's the only person in the unit. I – I got my fiancé and my two children out of the apartment and now my mom's in the hallway.

CALL TAKER: Okay.

10 R. KORCHINKSKI: I'm in the staircase and my sister is in front of the door arguing with my mom now because she thinks I left.

CALL TAKER: Okay. Where is your sister, is she in the apartment or —

R. KORCHINKSKI: She's in the apartment, and yes she has two knives on them.

15 CALL TAKER: Okay. She's in apartment...

R. KORCHINKSKI: And also ---

CALL TAKER: ... 2416?

20 R. KORCHINKSKI: Also bottles. Like, alcohol bottles that she broke. **[17:20:00]**

CALL TAKER: Okay. Is anyone there injured?

R. KORCHINKSKI: Me.

25 CALL TAKER: You're injured? Do you need an ambulance?

R. KORCHINKSKI: I don't – I don't even know. I just have scratches and, like, marks from the knife that I was wrestling her for and if there was on (inaudible) marks, (inaudible) but pretty sure I don't need an ambulance.

30 CALL TAKER: Okay. You don't need an ambulance?

R. KORCHINKSKI: Pardon me?

CALL TAKER: You don't need an ambulance? **[17:20:30]**

R. KORCHINKSKI: No, I do not need an ambulance, but....

CALL TAKER: Okay. And no one else there is injured?

R. KORCHINKSKI: No, no one else. I got my kids and my fiancé out of the apartment. And just my – my mom was trying to control the – me and my sister from arguing. But, obviously, once my sister pulled out the knives there is no controlling that, right? I just have to try to protect the family. This isn't the first time this is happening.

CALL TAKER: Okay. What were you...

R. KORCHINKSKI: Right? (inaudible)

CALL TAKER: ... fighting about? **[17:21:00]**

R. KORCHINKSKI: We were fighting over, um, the TV volume being too loud.

CALL TAKER: Okay. And you said that she's done this before?

R. KORCHINKSKI: Yeah, she's done this multiple different times. She has – my sister has elepsy[sic], right? She's epileptic and she has seizures. She had two seizures today. Every time she has a seizure I'm asked, and my family's asked to leave the apartment while she calms down, right? Today she said that she was calm so we came back **[17:21:30]** into the apartment and clearly she wasn't that calm, right. So....

CALL TAKER: Okay. So, she had two seizures today. What's her name?

R. KORCHINKSKI: Her name is Regis Paquet.

CALL TAKER: Can you spell her first name for me?

R. KORCHINKSKI: R-E-G-I-S P-A-Q-U-E-T, that's her last name.

CALL TAKER: P-A-Q -- spell that again for me?

R. KORCHINKSKI: P-A-Q-U-E-T.

CALL TAKER: Okay. What's her date of birth?

R. KORCHINKSKI: Her date of birth is [17:22:00] on [REDACTED].

CALL TAKER: [REDACTED]? Okay. And she's still there now?

R. KORCHINKSKI: Yeah. My mom and her are arguing because my mom doesn't want her to be here. She also doesn't want me to be here either because she feels that I should have let my sister run at me with a knife instead of protecting myself and getting the knife out of her hand, which I ultimately did before I left the apartment, right. I – I got both knives out of her hand and I threw them down the hall [17:22:30] in – in the apartment. And then I walked out of the apartment. So – but my mom, she feels like I should have just left instead of taking the – instead of taking them out of her hands. But at that point I still had children in the apartment.

CALL TAKER: Okay. Okay. We're going to have someone come and see you, right?

R. KORCHINKSKI: Okay. Thank you.

CALL TAKER: Okay. And just to confirm, does anyone there have any issues with COVID 19?

R. KORCHINKSKI: No.

CALL TAKER: Okay. No one there has any flulike symptoms?

R. KORCHINKSKI: No.

CALL TAKER: Okay. And does your sister have any mental health **[17:23:00]** issues?

R. KORCHINKSKI: Not that she's diagnosed with, no.

CALL TAKER: Okay.

R. KORCHINKSKI: Besides – besides the elepsy, right. It's a health condition.

CALL TAKER: Okay. Has she been...

R. KORCHINKSKI: It's like she doesn't know...

CALL TAKER: ... drinking today?

R. KORCHINKSKI: ... what she's doing, right? Like, my sister doesn't know what she's doing.

CALL TAKER: Yeah.

R. KORCHINKSKI: Because tonight she'll apologize to me, if I don't end up going to jail, for trying to protect myself and my family.

CALL TAKER: Okay. Okay.

R. KORCHINKSKI: All right. Thank you. I'm -- I'll be here...

CALL TAKER: Just stay on the line with me.

R. KORCHINKSKI: ... for when the police come.

CALL TAKER: Do you have any weapons on you?

R. KORCHINKSKI: No, I do not have any weapons on me.

CALL TAKER: Okay. So, you were **[17:23:30]** taking them from your sister and then she got them back?

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R. KORCHINKSKI: Yeah. Because I just threw them down the hallway inside of the apartment. But pretty much all she did was just smash all my stuff and now once I left the apartment. But actually, broke the TV before I left but after I left smashed my other TV in the bedroom, destroyed clothing, destroyed....

CALL TAKER: Okay. So, she has the knives with her now?

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R. KORCHINKSKI: Yeah. She has knives in the apartment to my knowledge. I'm only in the staircase, I don't know what's going on. I just hear arguing in the -- in ...
